Scammers can be convincing and may even tell you what to say.

If something doesn't feel right, let's talk.



COMMON SCAM WARNING SIGNS



You were contacted unexpectedly by phone, email, or text.



Someone asked you to keep the transaction a secret.



You're being asked to withdraw cash, buy gift cards, or send money.



You were told your account is compromised or at risk.



You feel pressured to act immediately.



Someone says not to tell the bank, family, or anyone else.



You've been asked to lie or give false information.



You're asked to wire money or send money through an app.



You're asked to invest in cryptocurrency or other "guaranteed" investments.



Someone you don't know well is offering you a job or business opportunity that seems too good to be true.



Someone is waiting for you outside or on the phone while you're in the bank.

COMMON SCAM EXAMPLES



IMPOSTER TAX SCAMS

Scammers pretend to be from the IRS or another government agency. They demand payment for back taxes or threaten arrest.



GRANDPARENT SCAMS

You get a call saying your grandchild is in trouble or in jail and needs money right away. They may even have someone pretend to be your grandchild.



FAKE LAW ENFORCEMENT

Scammers claim to be an officer and say your account is involved in a crime. They tell you to withdraw money to "protect" it.



TECH SUPPORT SCAMS

Someone says they're from Microsoft or another tech company and that your computer is infected. They ask for payment or access to your accounts.



GIFT CARD SCAMS

You're asked to buy gift cards to pay bills, taxes, or "help" someone. Once the card numbers are shared, the money is gone for good.



PAYPAL SCAMS

You receive a fake email or message claiming there's a problem with your account. You're asked to click a link, confirm personal info, or send money. It's not PayPal—it's a scam.



ROMANCE SCAMS

Someone you meet online builds a relationship and then asks for money for an emergency, travel, or a special reason. It's all fake.



ONLINE PURCHASE SCAMS

You pay for an item online, but it never arrives. The seller disappears or the website is fake.
